

On International Day of Democracy, Elections Ontario reflects on its 100-year anniversary

TORONTO, September 15, 2020 – In recognition of the United Nations' International Day of Democracy, Elections Ontario today participated in the Canadian Vote Summit, a virtual event hosted by Ryerson University's Democratic Engagement Exchange.

Ontario's Chief Electoral Officer, Greg Essensa, delivered remarks on the importance of electoral management bodies like Elections Ontario in addressing the COVID-19 pandemic to ensure free and fair elections while maintaining voter health and safety. The Chief Electoral Officer also reflected on Ontario's electoral history as Elections Ontario marks its 100th anniversary this year.

Joining the event was Professor Laura Stephenson, co-director of the Consortium on Electoral Democracy, who provided attendees with an analysis of the 2019 Canadian Elections Study Report.
